THREE FSU SOFTBALL PLAYERS EARN ALL-AMERICAN HONORS

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.-- Florida State softball senior Shama Wilson, the Atlantic Coast Conference Player of the Year, has earned Louisville Slugger NSCA first team All-American honors, the National Softball Coaches Association released today. Teammates Renee Espinoza and Myssi Calkins were named second team All-Americans.

Wilson, who led Florida State to the championship day of NCAA Regionals last weekend, was a College Sports preseason All-American. She earned second team honors as a sophomore and third team honors last season. In 1996, Wilson led the Seminoles, and the country, with 69 stolen bases and was the team leader with a .402 batting average. She is also a three-time All-South Region first team selection.

Espinoza, who went 30-7 this season with a team-leading 0.83 ERA, entered Florida State two seasons ago as a first team Junior College All-American. A two-time first team All-South Region selection, Espinoza, a senior, led FSU to its fourth ACC Tournament title and second consecutive. She earned Most Valuable Player honors at the Championships with a 3-0 record.

Calkins, a junior, has had the best season of her career. Batting .358 for the season, Calkins established personal bests in batting, hits (69), RBI's (21), steals (54) and runs scored (48). She was also recently named a first team All-South Region selection for the first time in her career.

NATIONAL SOFTBALL COACHES ASSOCIATION ANNOUNCES 1996 LOUISVILLE SLUGGER NCAA DIVISION I ALL-AMERICANS

COLUMBUS, GEORGIA -- Women's College World Series' No. 1 seed Washington and No. 2 seed Arizona each placed three players on the Louisville Slugger NSCA All-American first team. The Pacific-10 Conference was represented on the first team with eight members.

Husky senior pitcher Heather Meyer, who was just 3-1 last year as a junior, led the first team pitchers with a mark of 23-3 and an ERA of 0.93. Meyer was joined on the squad by fellow Washington players, Michelle Church (first base) and Sara Pickering (at large-second base). The trio led the Huskies to their first Pac-10 title under head coach Teresa Wilson.

Arizona's Jenny Dalton, who drove in a phenomenal 104 RBI and smashed 23 home runs, was the first team selection at second base, and she was joined by teammates Lety Pineda (catcher) and Alison Johnsen (outfield). Pineda, only a sophomore, batted .406 with 90 RBI and 13 home runs.

Joining the Washington and Arizona standouts on the first team are: B'Ann Burns, pitcher, UCLA; Cheryl Longeway, pitcher, USL; Christine Kubin, third base, North Carolina; Ali Viola, shortstop, Nebraska; Shamalene Wilson, outfield, Florida State; Rachel Nelson, outfield, Minnesota; Lisa Dacquisto, designated player, Arizona State; Sara Griffin, utility, Michigan; Lindsay Parker, at-large pitcher, Fresno State; Scia Maumausolo, at-large catcher, Cal State Northridge; Kendall Richards, at-large shortstop, Texas A & M; and Nina Lindenberg, at-large second base.
