

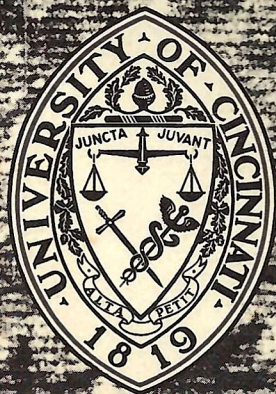

WHEREAS, swimmers and divers from colleges and universities all over the United States will compete in Cincinnati that week, and;


WHEREAS, Cincinnati is recognized as a major competitive swimming area in the United States,

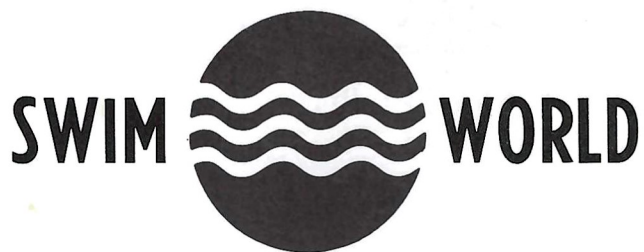

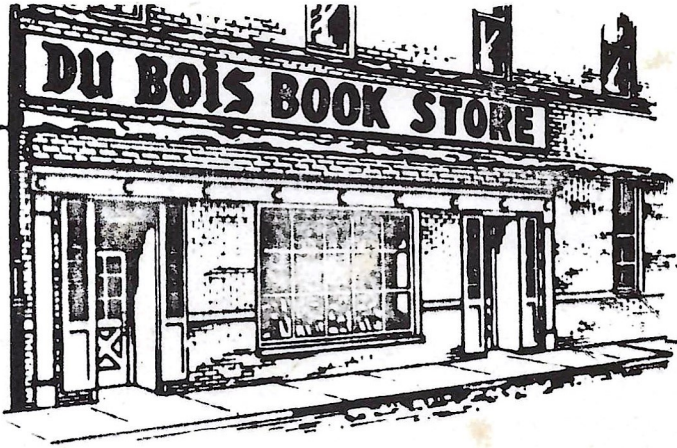

West Chester Leads Coed Swim At UC

West Chester State of Pennsylvania took the early lead with 85 points to defending titlist Arizona State with 69 in opening day action Thursday of the Women's National Intercollegiate Swimming and Diving Championships at UC's Laurence Hall pool.

Led by Heidi Lipe and Jacki Hirsky who won individual national championships in the 400- and 100-yard freestyle events respectively, host University of Cincinnati gained third place with 54 points.

Xavier stood tied for 17th with 10 points as 33 schools broke into the scoring column.

Brenda Christ of Indiana State won the 100-yard backstroke and set a meet record time of 1:00.9 for the event in the preceding preliminary heat.

Joanne Washcalus of Virginia Commonwealth recorded a meet record time of 1:02.9 as she swam to first place in the 100-yard individual medley. Mary Pakenas of East Stroudsburg successfully defended her 50-yard breaststroke title in 32.7.

Lipe, a UC freshman from Anderson High, gets credit for a record with her 4:09.3 clocking in the 400-free, a new meet event. She was seven seconds ahead of her nearest competitor in the longest race of the meet which is contested on a time basis.

Hirsky nipped Lipe for the 100-free title as UC swimmers produced a 1-2 finish.

Xavier's Kathy Keating took fifth place in the 50-yard breaststroke and UC's Alice Jones was eighth in the 100-individual medley. Cincy's Donna Yeomans was ninth in the 400-free-style.

Today's schedule calls

for swimming preliminaries at 9:30 a. m., diving prelims at 1 p. m. and finals in both at 6 p. m.

Today's 100-yard butterfly is expected to match Washington standout Lynn Colella and UC's Alice Jones who were one-two in the 200-meter butterfly at last year's Pan American Games.

Six of the diving competitors have already qualified for the Olympic Trials in July.

Lynn's Win Decided In July

Lynn Colella, the University of Washington star, was best at the last splash and whipped University of Cincinnati's sensation, Alice Jones, in record time in the featured 100-yard butterfly super swim of the Women's Intercollegiate Swimming and Diving Championships Friday night at Laurence Hall on the UC campus.

Lynn's time was 59.3 seconds, best ever for the event in the three-year history of the games, and almost a second better than Alice's 1:00.2. History will record that for all time.

Actually, the race was decided last July in the Pan American Games at Cali, Columbia.

Lynn knows it. Alice admits it.

"She hasn't been swimming that well," volunteered Miss Colella, moments after her record was announced to the enthusiastic crowd, mostly contestants, crammed into the stands located along side the pool.

"It all goes back to a bad summer," confirmed Miss Jones, who at 20 already has set two world records. "The Pan American Games... I've been down... mentally and physically."

Lynn and Alice are amazing girls, for despite their fierce competitive history (each knows for instance she'll be thrust against the other at every meet), they are impeccable friends.

So totally knowledgeable is Lynn about Alice and Alice about Lynn that at the morning preliminaries Miss Colella knew something was wrong. This even though Alice was

clocked in the then record meet time of 1:00.5.

"Look," said Lynn. "I know she can do 57 seconds."

So it was that a supremely confident Lynn Colella knifed through the water to her record.

"I try to convince myself before every race that I'm going to win," said Lynn, leaning on the psyche phrase so common in sports these days.

Four other girls were thrown into the championship race, but all the spectators focused on lane No. 3 (Miss Jones) and 4 (Miss Colella). The race—and exciting it was, too—really was between the two.

Inches separated the two for most of the first three lengths of the 25-yard long pool. Then in the stretch Lynn moved ahead by a foot, maybe two feet and maintained it.

"I was pretty sure half way down the last length that I had it," said Lynn. "I think I got ahead at the last turn."

Alice wouldn't concede. "I still had to fight her," said Miss Jones.

There was nothing to fight.

For Miss Colella, it was records back to back. Minutes earlier, she easily won the 100-yard breast stroke in 1:08.8 (beating her own record by almost two seconds). It wasn't even close.

Both girls will move on to the National Amateur Athletic Union championships, then the Olympic Trials. Hopefully, both will be teammates for the United States team in Munich this summer.

It's been whispered that both, at the ripe age of 20, are losing the competitive edge and will retire following the Olympic Games. This isn't exactly true.

"I'd like to stay competitive at least another year," says Miss Colella, a dean's list electrical engineering student who wants a master's degree then into the computer electronics field. "I don't want to quit next."

W. Chester Wins Fem Swim Meet

West Chester State, the steady leader throughout the three-day event, captured the third annual Women's National Intercollegiate Swimming and Diving Championships that concluded Saturday in UC's Laurence Hall pool.

The winning team, coached by Barbara Leighton, totaled 232 points to dethrone Arizona State, winner of the first two championships but runner-up this time with 194 points.

Host University of Cincinnati finished a surprisingly strong third with 182 points.

Individual star of the meet was Washington's Lynn Colella who won her third title and once again with the flourish of a record time. Saturday she lowered the 200-yard freestyle mark to 1:56.4 in outdistancing UC's Heidi Lipe by more than one second.

For all intents and purposes, West Chester wrapped up the No. 1 position right off the bat, winning the 400-yard medley relay in the record time of 4:10.7.

Marcia Middle of Colorado State won the 50-yard butterfly for the third straight year, touching out Minnesota's Mary Jablonski. UC's Alice Jones took fourth in the 50-fly.

Cincy's 200-yard freestyle relay pulled an upset by beating out West Chester as Jacki Hirsty pulled away swimming anchor. Patti Lotspeich, Lipe and Jones were her UC teammates.

Indiana's Jerrie Adair, third Friday night on the low board, came back to win the 3-meter diving in a close contest with Long Beach State's Debby Lipman, runner-up for the second night in a row. Defending champion Barbara Schaefer of Clarion State finished third.

Five of the top six divers on the high board (Adair, Lipman, Schaefer, D'Lynn Damron and Carolyn Bennett) already have qualified for the upcoming Olympic Trials.
