

# Lady swimmers fall to Gators

GAINESVILLE — The Lady Seminole swim team won six of 15 events but it was not enough as the Lady Gators defeated the FSU Women's team by a 68-62 margin Saturday afternoon in the Gator pool.

Jackie Walker captured two events for the Lady Seminoles with victories in the 200 and 400 - yard free style. The other firsts came in the 200-medley with Mary Montgomery, 50-yard fly with Susie Clark, 100-yard breast with Newton with the team of Montgomery, Clark, Walker and McCartie winning the 400-yard free style relay.

The loss leaves the Lady Seminole swim team with an 0-3 record which they will carry to Chapel Hill to face University of North Carolina next Saturday.

## Gators clip FSU

Florida's Lady Gators edged FSU's Lady Seminoles 68-62 Saturday afternoon in a swim meet held in Gainesville. The loss left the Lady

Seminoles winless for the season with an 0-3 mark in dual competition.

Jackie Walker lead the Lady Tribe in defeat, splashing out wins in the 200- and 400-yard freestyle events.

Other individual first place finishes for the Florida State women were Mary Montgomery in the 200-medley, Susie Clark in the 50-yard fly, and Barbie Newton in the 100-yard breaststroke.

The final FSU win was a team effort, with Montgomery, Clark, Walker and McCartie taking the 400-yard freestyle relay.

The Lady Seminole swimmers will travel to Chapel Hill next Saturday to face North Carolina.

A scheduled match between the Florida-Florida State men's swimming teams had been cancelled earlier in the week, apparently because the Gators were unable to field a team.

### *Clinic set*
