The lady tankers will have contenders in eight events, with sophomore Laura Barber qualifying for a spot in all eight.

Barber has a good chance of placing in her specialty, the backstroke. She posted qualifying times in the 50, 100 and 200 yard backstroke events. The second-year swimmer out of Mississippi will also compete in the 200 freestyle and all four relays.

U-M swimmers tied with UCLA at AIAW nationals

FORT LAUDERDALE — University of Miami swimmers have broken their own U.S. records twice and are in a 156-156 tie with UCLA at the national swim meet of the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women.

Miami's defending champion team of Pat Hines, Janet Buchanan, Leesa Sward and Jodi Yambor broke the 1975 200-yard medley relay record of 1:49.76 with a 1:48.665 time in the preliminaries yesterday.

They then broke that record with 1:47.829.

Stanford was third in team standings after seven events with 140 points. Arizona State, 1974 AIAW champion, was fourth at 111.

Miami used a 2-3 finish in the last event, the 100-yard individual medley won by Lynn Vidali of San Jose State in 1:00.19, to pull even with UCLA. The winning time was a meet record, bettering the 1:00.64 time set by Prineton's Kathy Corcione in 1974.
