Lankford quits as ladies' head coach

Fifteen years of Florida State University tennis history came to an end with the recent announcement of the resignation of Ann Lankford as the Lady Seminole tennis coach.

Lankford's resignation was handed down to Women's Athletic Director, Marlene Furnell, citing overall work load and inadequate time to devote to the team and her classes.

"Ann wanted to relinquish her coaching responsibilities at the end of the season," said Furnell, "but decided to come back for one more year. However with all the road trips, the planning for the tournament and the other responsibilities involved with coaching she was not able to devote adequate time to her academic work.

"She felt that if she were to give adequate attention to her classes, which are her primary responsibility to the University, she would be slighting the tennis team and hurting the players' chances for development."

An FSU faculty member of twenty-nine years, Lankford in 1960 took over the sponsorship of what was then called the Racquettes, a tennis club under the jurisdiction of student activities. It is said that Lankford "changed a club into a team," and after many lean but fortunate years, in 1973 the Racquettes became the Lady Seminole tennis team.

Compiling an 88-47-4 record including a championship last year at the Mid-Atlantic Lawn Tennis Association tournament, she has gained national and local prominence through her work in organizing twelve Florida State Tennis Iostraments and through her active lifetime membership in the United States Lawn Tennis Association.

Having only one losing season since 1960. Lankford is respected by players and faculty members as Furnell cited. "She is appreciated for her long years of service and dedletion to the sport, and her influence has been felt not only at Florida State, but also all over the southeast. Ann Lankford's name has become synonomous with tennis."

Other victories in the Seminole rout were as follows: In singles, Janet Haworth defeated Phyllis Blackwell 6-4, 6-4; Jane Hirsch stopped Billie Abney 6-0, 6-1; Frances Metrill beat Betsy Jones 6-1, 6-4; and Mary Ellen Wilkerson bombed Laura Green 6-0, 6-2.

In doubles competition the outcome was much the same, as the Seminoles claimed two out of three matches. Despite the loss by Schweppe and Hirsch. Haworth and Merrill romped over Blackwell and Carson 6-1, 6-0, and Wilkerson and Barbara Hawkinson won over Jones and Green, 6-4, 6-7, 6-0.

"I though Chattanooga would be much more experienced than they were," laughed victorious coach Trenary.
