TALLAHASSEE, Fla.--Two Florida State University women's tennis players were chosen Monday to join the field at the NCAA Championship Tennis Tournament to be played in Albuquerque, N.M., May 19-22.

Senior Jaime Kaplan is the first Lady Seminole ever to be chosen to compete in the NCAA singles competition and she will join teammate Lee McGuire to compete in doubles play.

Florida State's Lady Seminole tennis team was overlooked when the team bids were handed out, despite the fact that coach Anne Davis' club swept to an impressive Metro Conference championship a week ago in New Orleans. The team finished 25-8 and narrowly missed the field of 16 teams.

Kaplan, a Macon, Ga. native, will be one of 64 singles players in the competition. She had a match record of 25-6 in 1983 and has played at No. 1 singles for the better part of two straight seasons. A transfer to FSU from Georgia, Kaplan is formerly the top-ranked junior player in the South.

McGuire, only a sophomore, has been sensational in her first two years at FSU. She led the Lady Seminoles in single victories as a freshman and was the team's most valuable player. A native of Lexington, Ky., McGuire was the Kentucky State Champion in 1980.

McGuire and Kaplan will be one of only 32 doubles teams represented at the national championships.
