The Gator men and women will take on Seminole squads at the Stults Aquatic Center. The women's competition begins at 11 a.m., followed by the men at 2 p.m. The meet opens the 1983 season for both schools.

The Florida men are the defending NCAA champions and the Gator women missed the crown by virtue of a false start in the final event.

The Gators will showcase several swimmers who are expected to compete in the 1984 Olympics.

Florida's Tracy Caulkins enters with 47 national long-course titles and 59 American records to her credit. "She is the premier swimmer in (collegiate) history," says FSU women's coach Terry Maul. "Tracy is the best swimmer who ever competed in the sport."

Other Olympic hopefuls on the Lady Gator side include diver Megan Neyer, a 1980 Olympian; Kathy Treible, Mary Wayte and Patty King.

"Florida is just an awesome collegiate women's swimming program," says Maul. "This will be a real test for our young team, which has 14 freshmen. But we won't back away. We're looking at this meet as a means to test ourselves."

Key matchups in the women's meet will come in the 200 freestyle where Sara Linke, Florida State's Olympic hopeful, will face Wayte. Both could end up on the U.S. Olympic team.

This will be FSU's first meet at the Stults Center in over a year, after recently completing nearly \$1 million of renovations. Both meets are free to the public.

FSU women net opening win

BATON ROUGE, La. — The Florida State University women's tennis team opened its 1983 season Thursday by claiming a 7-2 victory over Lamar University in the eight-team Lady Tiger Invitational at Louisiana State University.

Junior Lee McGuire, FSU's No. 1 singles player, defeated Lamar's Ann Happonen 6-2, 6-4, and teamed with freshman Sue Hatch to record a victory at No. 1 doubles.

McGuire and Hatch defeated Lamar's Cris Power and Carol Core 6-4, 6-3.

Other singles winners for fifth-year coach Anne Davis' squad were senior Lisa Ehr Gott (No. 2), junior Debbie Pollack (4), freshman Darlene Kennedy (5) and sophomore Patti Henderson (6).

In addition, FSU's Kennedy and Henderson teamed to record a victory at the No. 2 doubles spot. Florida State will battle top-seeded University of South Carolina today at 2 p.m.

Joining host LSU, South Carolina and unseeded FSU and Lamar are Rollins College; Northeast Louisiana; LSU; Rice; and Texas Tech.

"I was pleased, especially since it was our first match of the year," said Davis. "We got the jitters out of the way

and came away with a win. Our next match will be tough. South Carolina is strong. They were ranked sixth in the nation last year.

Nastase to battle Arias

Tennis stars Ilie Nastase and Jimmy Arias will compete against each other Dec. 7 in Tallahassee at the Tallahassee-Leon County Civic Center.

Reserved seat tickets are \$6 and \$8 and will go on sale in early November.

Nastase is one of six men to achieve an ATP ranking of No. 1 in the world — along with Connors, Borg, McEnroe, Lendl and Newcombe. He has won the French and Italian Open titles and the U.S. Open, French, Italian and Wimbledon doubles titles.

Arias's victories include the \$376,000 U.S. Clay Court Championships and a semi-final spot in the U.S. Open. He was voted Player of the Year in 1981 by Tennis Magazine.

There will be a 7 p.m. preliminary match pitting Florida State University's No. 1 doubles team against its counterparts at the University of Florida.
