Match Comments: This win puts Wake Forest in the ACC final for the third time in the last six years (1987, 1988) and it will be looking for its first title... This win also avenged a 5-4 loss to the Seminoles in Winston Salem last Sunday (4/12)... FSU's Nicki Ivy trailed 4-0, 40-15 in the third set at No. 5 singles, but roared back to win 25 of the next 32 points (6 straight games) and force doubles. Barker and Evans made the comeback a mere time extension of the match, though, when they quickly won at No. 1 doubles... This was Florida State's first year in the ACC... The only three teams to ever win women's ACC Tennis Championships are Clemson, Duke and North Carolina. Wake Forest will try to add to that list at noon Sunday against the Duke/UNC winner.
