DUKE FINISHES SECOND TO WAKE FOREST IN SOUTH FLORIDA WOMEN'S GOLF INVITATIONAL

The Duke womens' golf team shot a three-day 923 total to finish in second place at the 1994 Lexel Golf/USF Invitational, one shot off the champion Wake Forest's 922 pace.
