1994 ALL-CONFERENCE WOMEN'S TENNIS TEAM ANNOUNCED

Brannon Named Player of the Year; Sowell Named Rookie of the Year; Reen Named Coach of the Year

GREENSBORO, N.C. -- Conference Player of the Year Audra Brannon and Rookie of the Year Lori Sowell, both of Florida State, head the list of athletes selected to the 1994 All-Atlantic Coast Conference women's tennis team. The 14member team, selected by a vote of the league's head coaches, includes four players from Clemson, three from Duke, two each from Florida State, Virginia and Wake Forest and one from N.C. State.

Brannon, hailing from Hixson, Tenn., compiled a 17-7 overall record this year, including a 7-1 ACC record in dual matches to claim the No. 1 singles ACC flight title. A three-time all-conference honoree, Brannon currently is ranked 30th in singles this year in the Intercollegiate Tennis Association rankings.

Florida State teammate Sowell, the league's flight champion at No. 2 singles, garnered Rookie of the Year honorees after compiling an 18-5 singles record, including a 7-1 ACC mark during the regular season. Ranked 58th in the nation, the Fort Lauderdale, Fla., product has won 11 of her last 12 matches.

Clemson's Janice Durden leads the Tiger contingent on the All-ACC team. Durden tailied an 8-0 mark against ACC competition in singles, playing at the No. 1 and No. 2 spots. Ranked 38th nationally, she owns a 20-11 overall record for the season. She is joined by No. 4 flight champion Jan Barrett, who recorded a 7-1 mark in league play. With a 30-8 record, she is the team leader for most wins in singles competition. Two-time all-league selection Emma Peetz joins the list of 1994 honorees after claiming the No. 3 singles flight title and tallying a 23-14 singles record which includes a 6-2 mark in the ACC. She has a career singles record of 51-18 in just two seasons. Rounding out the Clemson representation is Boba Tzvetkova, who is listed No. 17 in the ITA rankings. She owns a 29-9 overall record, including a 5-2 ACC mark this year,

ACC Tournament MVP Wendy Lyons heads up the Blue Devil netters earning all-conference honors. Lyons, maked No. 19 by ITA, has compiled a 38-8 record this season, beginning the dual campaign at No. 2 but finishing the regular season as Duke's No. 1 player. Four-time All-ACC selection and two-time All-America Christine Neuman battled back from a wrist injury to compile a 7-2 overall record after seeing limited action. Monica Mraz, ITA's No. 35 player, earns her third all-league honor after collecting a 22-3 record. She has won 11 of her last 14 matches.

Currently ranked No. 25 by ITA, Jen Callen, a two-time All-ACC performer, was the runner-up in the race for the No. 1 flight crown, having compiled a 6-2 record on the season. She has a 15-7 overall record this season, including a 14-4 mark at No. 1. Teammate Alison Cohen, runner-up at No. 4 singles, merits her first All-ACC recognition after collecting a 29-10 record this season, including a 6-2 record in ACC play.

Featured on the All-ACC team from Wake Forest are Maggie Harris and Terry Ann Zawacki, Harris, the ACC flight champion at No. 5 singles with a record of 7-1, owns an overall mark of 29-11 in her initial season. Zawacki, a two-time allconference selection, listed No. 13 by ITA, has compiled a 27-14 overall record, including a 11-8 dual-match record.

Rounding out the team is N.C. State freshman Kylie Hunt, who helped lead the Wolfpack to its first winning season since 1987. She put together a 14-5 overall record for the season, including a 4-4 mark in ACC play.

Florida State coach Alice Reen was selected 1994 ACC Coach of the Year after leading the Seminoles to a 15-9 record and its first appearance in the ACC finals after finishing third each of their three years in the league. She owns a career mark of 41-28 in three years with the Seminoles.

Seminole Notes:

A Familiar Place: For the third consecutive year, the Seminoles are seeded third going into the ACC Championships. Florida State tied Clemson for second in the conference with a 6-2 mark but the Tigers defeated FSU this season, so they received the number two seed. The Seminoles will face North Carolina State in the first round.

What Happened Last Time Against the Wolfpack: Florida State defeated N.C. State 7-2 at the Scott Speicher Tennis Center in Tallahassee on March 13. The Seminoles entered the match with a two point deficit after defaulting the number six singles and number three doubles matches. However, FSU rallied and swept the remaining matches to come away with the victory.

Last Year in the Championships: In the first round, the Seminoles clinched a 5-4 win over North Carolina when Sandi Ecclestone and Elke Juul defeated Bradford and Cervenka in the number three doubles match, 7-5, 6-2. In the semifinals, Clemson managed a feat that had not been accomplished against FSU all season- it swept the doubles matches. Laura Randmaa and Juul won their singles matches to give FSU their two points in the 7-2 loss.

Up, Up and Away: Florida State garnered three selections as ACC Flight Champions. Audra Brannon was a double winner as she was named the number one singles flight champion and teamed with Elke Juul to become number one doubles flight champions. Lori Sowell became the ACC number two singles flight champion after compiling a 7-1 conference record. She and Jennifer Hyde were the runner-up flight champions at number two doubles.

Two in Top 100: For the first time in the last five years, Florida State has two players among the top 100 collegiate singles players. Currently, Audra Brannon is 34th, while team-mate Lori Sowell is tied for 69th. Brannon's ranking ties her for the highest of her career. Previously, she was ranked 34th in this year's preseason rankings. Sowell, only a freshman, has done something that no other rookie has done in the recent history and that is be ranked. The first year player out of Ft. Lauderdale, FL first broke into the rankings on March 15 when she placed 69th. After a brief drop to number 79th, Sowell has moved back up to 69th.

Brannon is also ranked in doubles with partner Elke Juul. The pair are currently ranked 21st although they have been as high as 17th.

A Mainstay in the Top 30: Ever since FSU broke the top 30 on March 25th, the Seminoles have hovered around #25. Currently Florida State is 26th. A rundown of the rankings:

Back at Full Strength: Florida State has had the pleasure of a full lineup for its last four matches. Ashley Delaney, a freshman from Lake City, FL, returned against Florida International after sitting out the previous 13 singles matches with a stress fracture in her leg. Delaney did return to double action at Rice on March 21.

Down But Not Out: Despite being without the services of a sixth player, the Seminoles fared remarkably well. In 13 matches with only five players, Florida State was 7-5. Included in that span were wins over #20 Wake Forest, #24 Virginia and #27 Texas A&M. In five matches, FSU entered with an 0-2 deficit, while the Seminoles spotted a point in eight other matches.

A Tough Go: Of Florida State's 21 matches this season, 15 have been against ranked opponents. In fact, of the other six opponents, three have moved into the top 50 in the latest rankings (Kentucky #17, South Florida t36, N.C. State t36). Florida State has also played three teams that were ranked at the top five at the time- #4 Florida, # 4 Georgia, #4 Texas. And FSU's record against all the ranked opponents? 8-7.
