Women tracksters are looking ahead

The 1973 version of the Florida State Women's Track Squad will return this year with 11 "letter" winners from last year's team. Their title as the "unofficial" eastern collegiate championship team will be lead by nationally ranked senior miler Sharon Burgess.

Having their best year ever during the 1971-72 season, a repeat performance is expected with such returning veterans as Joyce Dickinson, Jeanette Brown and Linda Crutchfield. Susan Ray, sidelined last year with surgery, is expected to return to the roster this time. Her versatility and leadership ability will add immensely to the potential of the team, tagged this year as "Miller's Killers".

Coach Kenneth Miller stated that in addition to Burgess, junior hurdler Dickinson and sophomore quarter-miler Brown had the potential to achieve national status during the coming season. Senior Peggy Reed is expected to contribute her talents as she has been termed as the most improved athlete on the squad.

The tentative schedule for the upcoming season indicates that the Seminole coeds will be a traveling squad. In addition to hosting the Tallahassee Invitational, the team will participate in meets at San Marcos, Texas; Richmond,

Kentucky; and Hayward, California as well as Miami and Gainesville.
