LADY SEMINOLES DEFEAT MARYLAND

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – The Florida State women's volleyball team stayed in contention for a strong ACC finish with another important conference win in the friendly confines of Tully Gymnasium. The Lady Seminoles dropped Maryland in three straight games, 15-10, 15-12, 15-3 on Sunday afternoon. The match-up featured a battle between the No. 6 and No. 7 ranked teams in the NCAA East Region. FSU, ranked seventh in the region, bettered its season mark to 18-9 on the season, and 6-6 in conference play.

"I thought it was very important for us to come in and win here against Maryland," FSU head coach Cecile Reynaud said. "This will help us to get back in the race in the ACC."

The Seminoles had strong performances on the afternoon from Jen Werrick and Erica Bunch, who both reached double digits in kills. Werrick nailed 15 kills on 27 attempts for the team high in kills, and ended the afternoon with a .370 percentage. Bunch notched 14 kills of her own, with a .265 percentage. Norisha Campbell and Kristin Frye added nine and seven kills, respectively. Dawn Hough spent the day at the net, denying almost everything that came her way. Hough smacked seven block assists and two solo blocks to lead the squad in both of those categories.

"I think that we served pretty well today," Reynaud said. "We kept them a little off balance and they couldn't run the middle."

The Tribe earned a hard-fought win over the Terps, after losing a five-game match to them earlier in the season. FSU dropped behind in the first two games to start things off. In game one, both teams traded five side outs before a single point was scored, a kill by Maryland to put the game at 0-1. FSU fought back, as they have all season and would continue to do throughout this game. The Lady Noles came up with two blocks, before Kristin Frye put down a kill to tie the game at 1-1. The Noles started to pull away, moving the score to 8-4 before a Maryland time out. FSU continued to pour on the pressure, pushing the score to 13-5, before Maryland began to strike back. Maryland pulled all the way back to 13-10, before FSU finally put them away in game one, 15-10.

The 'Noles were the ones fighting back in game two, as Maryland jumped out to a quick lead which Florida State quickly rebounded from. The Garnet and Gold fought from a six-point deficit to take the lead, and eventually win game two, 15-12. With two games already behind them, and the opportunity to out Maryland away for good at their fingertips, the Lady Seminoles wasted no time, moving out to a defining lead and eventually taking game three, 15-3.

FSU had a match-high 22 kills in game one, followed by 18 and 19 kills in games two and three, respectively. The Lady Seminoles hit an impressive .457 in game three, following a .261 in game one and a .093 in game two. The Lady Seminoles return to action on Friday, Nov. 3 as they play host to Wake Forest.
